The Presidente Hotel volunteers joined to the *Jornada Nacional de Limpieza* organized by Terra Nostra Foundation, Q-adra Project, and San José Municipality.

The cleanup day covered 5 areas of the capital, with a total of 220 volunteers, collecting around 2 tons of recyclable and non-recyclable waste.

An Uncommon Patriotic Parade

As part of the traditional national celebrations of September, Q-adra Project decided to make the cleanup day a day after the parade, with the aim of leaving the city clean and preventing waste from accumulating in sewers and causing flooding on the streets and sidewalks.
